Notice of Outcome: Expression of Interest for Supplementary Matter Starts in Immigration & Asylum Category of Law to deliver Legal Help in the London and /or Mid, South West & Coastal Kent Access Points

On 31 March 2017, the LAA invited existing Immigration & Asylum providers to submit Expressions of Interest (“EOI”) for Supplementary Matter Starts to deliver Immigration and Asylum Legal Help, specifically for providing advice to asylum seekers being transferred from other areas of the UK to London by National Asylum Seekers Support (NASS) and/or Unaccompanied Asylum Seeking Children (UASC) arriving in the UK following the closure of the camp at Calais.

Expressions of interest were sought from providers with an office in one or more of the following Access Points:

- London; and
- Mid, South West and Coastal Kent.

As a result of this EOI process the LAA awarded Supplementary Matter Starts to 12 Standard Civil Contract holders, across 14 offices.
