REQUEST FOR THE BREAKDOWN OF QUALITY AND PRICING SCORES FOR ALL BIDDERS, SUCCESSFUL AND UNSUCCESSFUL FOR THE A303 AMESBURY TO BERWICK DOWN TECHNICAL PARTNER TENDER.

I am writing to advise you that we do hold information that is relevant to your request for the breakdown of quality and pricing scores for all bidders, successful and unsuccessful, for the A303 Amesbury to Berwick Down technical partner tender dated 10 May but regret to inform you of my decision not to disclose this information.

The information you requested is being withheld in reliance on the exemption in section 43 [<u>http://www.legislation.gov.uk/ukpga/2000/36/section/43</u>] of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 because the disclosure of this information would be likely to prejudice the commercial interests of the bidders.

In applying this exemption we have had to balance the public interest in withholding the information against the public interest in disclosure. The key public interest factors for and against disclosure are detailed in Annex A below.

If you are unhappy with the way we have handled your request you may ask for an internal review within 2 months of the date of this response for Freedom of Information requests and within 40 days for Environmental Information Regulations requests. Our internal review process is available at:

Factors supporting disclosure	Factors supporting non-disclosure	
 There is a clear public interest in the work of government being closely examined to encourage the discharging of public functions in the most efficient and effective way There is a public interest in disclosing information about public procurements to ensure there is transparency in the spending of public money and that public bodies are getting value for money when entering into contracts. 	 Whilst the requestor is not asking for the prices to be disclosed, revealing the breakdown of scores for all bidders when read in conjunction with other information already in the public domain (scoring methodology published in the IfT) would result in other competitors in the market being able to determine the relative price differentials between the bidding companies, which is commercially sensitive information. The procurement process must be seen to be fair and that commercial interests of the suppliers or services are not unduly prejudiced by the release of commercially sensitive information. It is important that Highways England maintains the confidence of our suppliers in order to achieve best value for the tax payer.
