RE-DETERMINATION OF THE APPLICATION BY RWE NPOWER RENEMABLES LIMITED ("RWE") DATED 11 DECMEBR 2008 FOR CONSENT TO CONSTRUCT AND OPERATE A 130-250MW WIND TURBINE GENERATING STATION IN POWYS, MID WALES ("CARNEDD WEN")

Objection to proposals for wind generation stations in Carnedd Wen & Llanbrynmair.

The developers should not continue to challenge the decision of the Secretary of State which was to turn down the applications for these wind "farms".

The wind farms cannot go ahead if there is no way of getting any transmission, so any decision should have to consider the Mid Wales Connection as well. That was not acknowledged properly in the Public Inquiry as such, and still seems to be "forgotten about". The vast majority of people living in Montgomeryshire do not want these wind farms to go ahead, and even less want the 400 KV connection line. If the decision was to allow these applications to proceed, it would be unforgivable.

I have farmed all of my life, and realise the value of protecting what we have. The local people have spoken and have loudly said "enough is enough".

There is no more to be said.
