Thank you for your email of 2 August 2017 requesting the following information:

'I am requesting the following information:

1. The reason for the firing range at Hythe Kent is used from 8.30 till 23.,00 hours for over 20 days in August alone?

Why so many late nights.

2. Most weekends including Sundays.

3. Could this exercise not be shared with Lydd?

4. How many private organisations use this site, especially at weekends, s the firing pattern is different.i.e Gun clubs

5. Has the noise level been monitored, as this may well breach health and safety levels both in volume and intensity and against WHO protocols for this complaint.

I fully appreciate the important work that the armed forces do to protect the country, but there seems to be a constant barrage of rapid firing 7 days a week.

6. Do you liase with Shepway council, and who is it I can discuss this with ? name and phone number please?

'This has come to the attention of the local community, and the recent residential development of over a 100 dwellings alongside the range seems to have caused an increase in the noise levels. One can only imagine what the noise levels are like living within 30 metres of the boundary, when they are occupied?

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence (MOD) and I can confirm that all of the information in scope of your request is held.

1. The reason for the firing range at Hythe Kent is used from 8.30 till 23.,00 hours for over 20 days in August alone? Why so many late nights:

The reason for the use of Hythe Ranges is because of military training, which at times requires firing at night.

2. Most weekends including Sundays.

Although firing can be conducted all weekends of the year, currently only every other weekend is open to users. Weekend firing can be increased in times of major operational deployments.

Could this exercise not be shared with Lydd?

These exercises could not be conducted at Lydd as both range complexes offer different types of live fire facilities to meet specific operational requirements.

4. How many private organisations use this site, especially at weekends, s the firing pattern is different.i.e Gun clubs

A total of 23 local gun clubs use Hythe Ranges. Hythe Ranges are currently only open for firing every other weekend. Gun clubs can only use the facility at Hythe when military units are on site also using the ranges. On average, between one – seven gun clubs may use the facility at weekends when the ranges are open and military units are also on site.

5. Has the noise level been monitored, as this may well breach health and safety levels both in volume and intensity and against WHO protocols for this complaint.

Noise levels are monitored and there is no record of noise exceeding statutory limits.

6. Do you liase with Shepway council, and who is it I can discuss this with ? name and phone number please?
