





Animal Feed Statistics for Great Britain – October 2017

Key points

- Animal feed production was up 18% for sheep, 9.2% for cattle and calves, 6.2% for pigs and up 1.4% for poultry in October 2017 compared to October 2016.
- 3.3% more wheat was used to produce animal feed in October 2017 than October 2016 and 19% more barley.
- Over the crop year from July to October, animal feed production was up 24% for sheep, 10% for cattle, 4.8% for pigs and 1.8% for poultry compared to the previous crop year.
- Over the crop year from July to October, wheat used to produce animal feed was up 1.4% and 35% for barley compared to the previous crop year.

Usage of the Statistics

The UK government and the European Commission use these statistics to monitor and assess stocks of cereals as a key component of our food security. The estimates contribute to the UK cereal balance sheets published by the Agricultural and Horticultural Development Board <u>AHDB</u>. Animal feed processors and grain traders use the estimates to help assess market conditions and inform business decisions.

Revisions

We have reviewed some IPU's (Integrated Poultry Units) which produce both feed for their own use and feed for retail sale. We have adjusted the data from August 2015 which has resulted in an increase in compound poultry feed and a decrease in IPU feed. This statistical notice has been updated with final 2016 data for those smaller companies which are only surveyed annually. Data for July 2017 has been amended due to changes in Compound/IPU split.

- 1. Data are from Defra's monthly animal feed surveys which cover all animal feed processors and integrated poultry units in Great Britain.

Compound animal feed prices - key points

- The quarterly average price of Cattle and Calf compounds between July and September 2017 was £215 per tonne
- The quarterly average price of Pig compounds between July and September 2017 was £233 per tonne
- The quarterly average price of Poultry compounds between July and September 2017 was £257 per tonne
- The quarterly average price of Sheep compounds between July and September 2017 was £225 per tonne
