Notice is hereby given that the above referenced Order has been submitted to the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for determination. An Inspector will be appointed by the Secretary of State to determine the Order(s).

The **start date** for the above Order is **28 June 2017**

Consideration of the Order will take the form of a public local inquiry.

The Inquiry will be held at: **Hollesley Village Hall, Hollesley, Woodbridge, IP12 3QU** on **Wednesday 15 November 2017** at 10.00am.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to modify the definitive map and statement for the area by adding Public Footpath 65 from Restricted Byway 54 (Hollesley) at Ordnance Survey Grid reference 63506,24491 continuing in a generally westerly direction through the Black Ditch Plantation to the junction of Public Footpaths 3 and 4 (Hollesley) at Ordnance Survey Grid reference 63440,24494, as shown on the order plan.

Timetable for sending in statements of case and proofs of evidence

Within 8 weeks of the start date by 23 August 2017

The Order Making Authority must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send a copy (excluding copies of any supporting documents - these will be available to view at the Authority's offices) to everyone who has made an objection or representation and the applicant and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order.

Within 14 weeks of the start date by 4 October 2017

Everyone who has made an objection or representation and anyone who wishes to give evidence at the Inquiry must ensure their statement of case¹ is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send full copies to the Authority. Copies will also be sent to the applicant, every person who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order (excluding copies of any supporting documents - these will be available to view at the Authority's offices).

Within the same period the applicant (if applicable) must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send a full copy to the Authority. Copies will also be sent to everyone who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order (excluding copies of any supporting documents - these will be available to view at the Authority's offices).

4 weeks before the date of the inquiry by 18 October 2017

The Authority, everyone who has made an objection or representation, the applicant (if applicable) and anyone who wishes to give evidence at the Inquiry must ensure their proof of evidence (together with any summary) is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send copies of:

- i) the Authority's proof of evidence to everyone who has made an objection or representation, the applicant and anyone who has submitted a statement of case (excluding copies of any supporting documents – although none should be submitted with a proof of evidence);
- ii) the applicant's proof of evidence to the Authority, everyone who has made an objection or representation and anyone else who has submitted a statement of case (excluding copies of any supporting documents – although none should be submitted with a proof of evidence); and
- iii) all other proofs of evidence to the Authority, the applicant, everyone who has made an objection or representation and anyone else who has submitted a statement of case (excluding copies of any supporting documents – although none should be submitted with a proof of evidence).

All parties must keep to the timetable set out above and ensure that statements of case and proofs of evidence are received by the Secretary of State on time. Late documents will be returned.

SUFFOLK COUNTY COUNCIL (DEBEN RURAL DISTRICT DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT)(PARISH OF HOLLESLEY) MODIFICATION ORDER 2016

This Order is made by Suffolk County Council under section 53(2)(b) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 ("the Act"), because it appears to that authority that the Definitive Map and Statement for the former Rural District of Deben in the former Administrative County of East Suffolk require modification in consequence of the occurrence of an event specified in section 53(3)(b) namely, the expiration, in relation to a footpath in the area to which the map and statement relates, of such a period that the enjoyment by the public of the footpath during that period raises a presumption that the footpath has been dedicated as a public path.

The authority has consulted with every local authority whose area includes the land to which the Order relates. The Suffolk County Council hereby Order that:

1. For the purpose of this Order the relevant date is 1 November 2016.
2. The Definitive Map and Statement for the former Rural District of Deben in the former Administrative County of East Suffolk shall be modified as described in Part I and Part II of the Schedule and shown on the map attached to the Order.
3. This Order shall take effect on the date it is confirmed and may be cited as the Suffolk County Council (Deben Rural District Definitive Map and Statement)(Parish of Hollesley) Modification Order 2016.

SCHEDULE

Part I: Modification of Definitive Map

Description of public footpath to be added

There shall be added to the Definitive Map for the former Rural District of Deben in the parish of Hollesley a public footpath from a point at Ordnance Survey grid reference 6350624491 to a point at Ordnance Survey grid reference 6344024494 as shown on the attached map.

Part II: Modification of Definitive Statement

Particulars of public footpath to be added

There shall be added to the Definitive Statement for the former Rural District of Deben in the parish of Hollesley the following particulars:

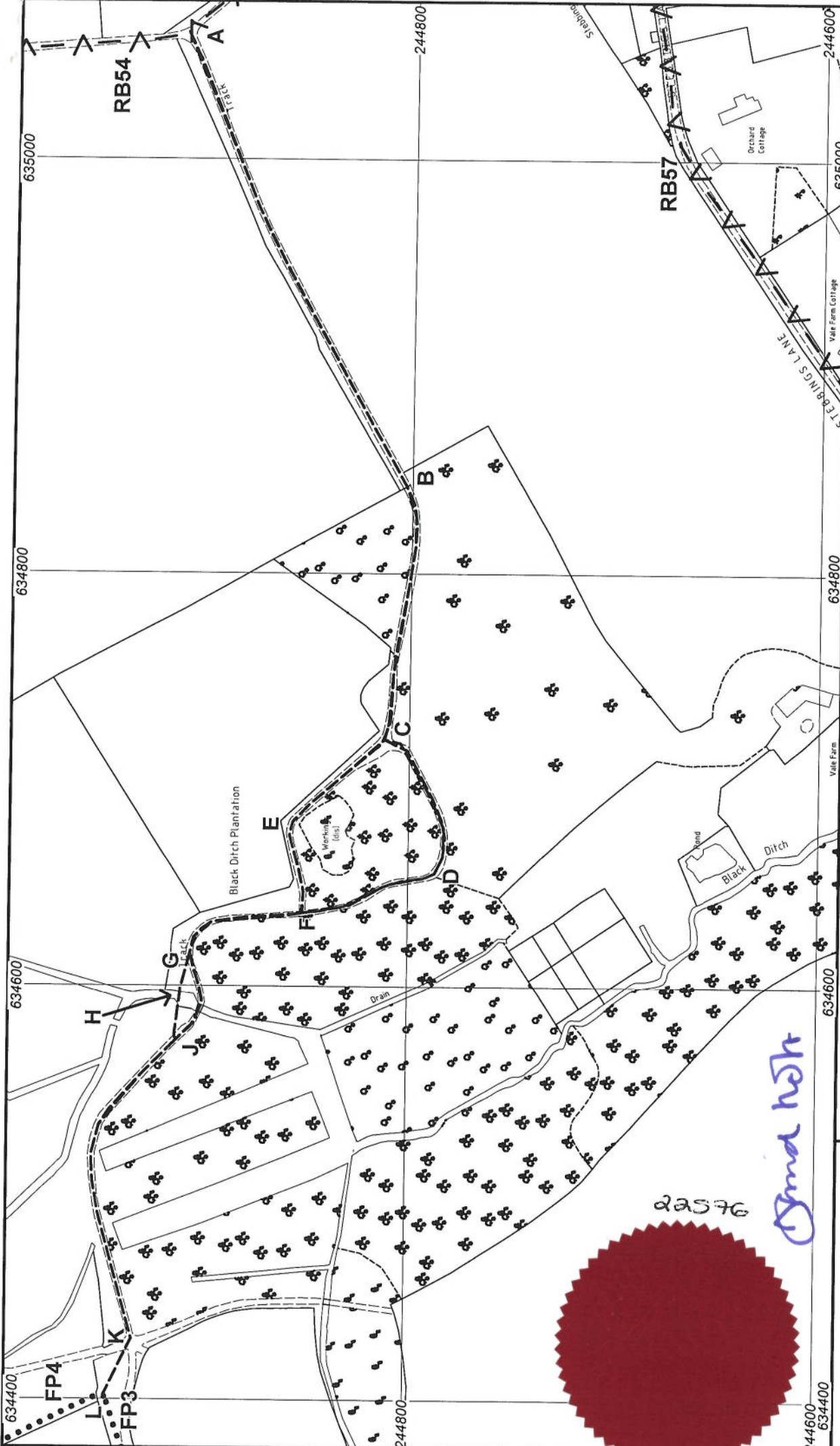
Hollesley Footpath 65

Commencing at a junction with Restricted Byway 54 at Ordnance Survey grid reference (OSGR) 63506 24491 (point A) and continuing in a west south west direction on a field edge track for 245 metres to the entrance to woodland at OSGR 63484 24480 (point B) and continuing west for 124 metres to OSGR 63471 24481 (point C). At point C the path divides and passes around both sides of a sand excavation pit, via OSGR 63465 24478 (point D) to the south for 145 metres and via OSGR 63467 24485 (point E) to the north for 104 metres, the two paths re-join on the track at OSGR 63463 24485 (point F); continuing north and then west on the track for 63 metres to OSGR 63461 24490 (point G); where the path divides again, with the southern route continuing on the track for 47 metres and the northern route proceeding west for 43 metres and crossing a footbridge over the Black Ditch watercourse at OSGR 63459 24491 (point H). The two paths re-join at OSGR 63457 24491 (point J) and continue along the track, north west and then west south west for 161 metres to OSGR 63442 24493 (point K), where the path leaves the track to cross open grass land in a west north west direction for 30 metres to the junction of Public Footpaths 3 and 4 at OSGR 63440 24494 (point L).

Width: 2 metres

Based on an average of widths stated by users.

Limitation: A farm gate at OSGR 63484 24480 (point B).
