In clarification I was also requesting the total expenditure on pensions, by country, for the same group of people in the same one year period i.e. item (c) in your list of options.

However I realise that it is impossible to calculate the average pension awarded by country using this data, as people will have been in receipt of the pension for less than a full year.

Instead are you able to supply the actual average weekly pension for people starting their pensions in the year starting 1st April 2011, by country?
