Vision¹

Change

DCMS is changing through a combination of an expanded Digital brief and EU
Exit. These factors will significantly increase the size of DCMS and, together
with cross government initiatives, practical but innovative property and flexible
working solutions are being explored to minimise the impact of such change.

Holdings and future requirements

 Significant DCMS holdings include offices in Whitehall and Sheffield (under agreements with HMG departments), a commercial lease in central London

for managing the Government Art Collection and responsibility for Somerset House and Blythe House.

- Future requirements include
 - Additional office space in Whitehall to accommodate the increasing departmental headcount
 - A fit for purpose base for Government Art Collection within core government estate
 - Northern Hub Exploring the possibility of a departmental base in the North of England

Cross government initiatives²

DCMS is working collaboratively across government with Cabinet Office, HM
Treasury and other government departments to deliver transformational
change in key areas, including rationalising our estate in a joined-up way,
looking to develop 'government hubs' with other government departments,
releasing land for housing where possible and participating in the
development of the new commercial property model

Other property programmes and professional capability

- Departmental property transformation programmes include;
 - o Relocation of Government Art Collection
 - o Relocation of museum collections from, and disposal of, Blythe House
 - o Feasibility engagement in the relocation of public bodies located in London and the surrounding area
- Departmental resources continue to be supported where required in the property profession through maintaining collaborative working relationships with GPU, GPA and PAMU. Internal capability in the property profession will be monitored to ensure access to adequate resource to deliver on current and future requirements
