**FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000. MINISTRY OF DEFENCE POLICE:
CYBERCRIME TRAINING**

I refer to your e-mail of 8 January 2018, which was acknowledged on the 9 January 2018.

We are treating your e-mail as a request for information in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA 2000).

In your e-mail you requested the following information:

**“ Breakdown of the total number of employees who have been through cybercrime training over the last three years 2017, 2016 and 2015
Estimated expenditure on cyber training/courses”**

A search for information has now been completed by the Ministry of Defence Police and I can confirm that we do hold some information in scope of your request.

The Ministry of Defence Police primarily carry out an armed policing role at MOD Establishments, so there is no requirement for them to complete this type of training. However, 14 officers and non-uniformed staff within the Intelligence Bureau have carried out courses relating to cybercrime in the last 3 years, at a cost of approximately £1500 per course.
