Number of people killed or serious as a result of jumping or falling from a bridge on Highways England network in 2017.

I refer to your request under the Environmental Information Regulations 2004 for information about the number of people killed or serious as a result of jumping or falling from a bridge on Highways England network in 2017. I am dealing with it under the terms of the Environmental Information Regulations (EIR) 2004.

This is because the information requested concerns measures and activities affecting or likely to affect elements of the environment or affect factors such as noise, pollution discharges and other releases into the environment.

This information is not held centrally by Highways England. Road accidents on the public highway in Great Britain, that are reported to the police and which involve human injury or death, are recorded by police officers onto a STATS19 report form. The form collects a wide variety of information about the accident (such as time, date, location, road conditions) together with the vehicles and casualties involved and contributory factors to the accident (as interpreted by the police). The form is completed at either the scene of the accident, or when the accident is reported to the police.

The Department for Transport (DfT) has overall responsibility for the collection of STATS19 data. You therefore may wish to contact the road accident statistics team in DfT at: roadacc.stats@dft.gsi.gov.uk or access existing statistical data via https://www.gov.uk/government/collections/road-accidents-and-safety-statistics
