Further to our telephone conversation regarding your Racoons, firstly I would remind you that we do require at least 14 days written notice before acquiring a wild animal for use in a travelling circus. In addition to the above formal written notification, please can you also provide the following information relating to their acquisition: the date of birth of the animals; the name and address of the person/business you acquired them from; and the date that they came into your possession.

If Rio is part of a flying display his/her dietary and feeding requirements will change when he/she no longer performs and on the advice of the Lead Veterinary Surgeon this diet will be assessed and if necessary altered to suit his/her age.

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
