INTRODUCTION

1. Background OPTAG have been tasked to coordinate elements of training for 19 Mech Bde who are to deploy on Op TELIC 2. The training will be split into 2 parts; 12-16 May 03 centred on Catterick Garrison for HQ and Sig Sqn 19 Inf Bde, 1 KOSB, 1 Kings, 1QLR, 40 Regt RA and 38 Regt RE and 19-22 May 03 for one squadron of the LD centred on Swanton Morley. A separate instruction will be issued for the delivery of training for the LD.

2. Assumptions. The following assumptions have been made in the planning of the training:

- a. That all units are required to be trained in infantry IS skills.
- b. That LWC will nominate an Infantry training team to 40 Regt RA and 38 Regt RE for the period 19 - 23 May 03 to assist with "conversion" training.
- c. That the emphasis of the OPTAG training, less the All Ranks Briefing and Team Medic Course, will be on Train the Trainer (T3).
- d. That units will be allocated resources in terms of time and real estate to allow the cascading of the training.
- e. That LWC will issue sufficient IS equipment to allow the delivery of T3 and its subsequent cascading of training.

3. Principles It is important that the following principles in relation to OPTAG training are noted:

- a. The training delivered is that directed by Comd 19 Mech Bde.
- b. The cascading of training is the responsibility of COs.
- c. It is assumed that units are best prepared in warfighting skills prior to embarking on OPTAG training.

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d. OPTAG will teach the generic principles, while units will apply them to the operational situation.

ADMINISTRATION

8. Costs Costs will lie where they fall and should be charged to the Op TELIC UIN.
9. Recce OPTAG will conduct a recce over the period 6-7 May. The team will be headed by Maj [REDACTED] (ATN 94281 2264, Mobile 07900052867) and WO2 [REDACTED] (ATN 94281 2363). Recce to include trg facilities central presentations locations and other training facilities.
10. Accommodation and Feeding HQ 19 Mech Bde are requested to arrange accommodation and feeding for instructors working on behalf of OPTAG. Detailed requirements will follow.
11. Weapons and Ammunition The administrative element of each Annex will indicate the requirement for ammunition and Weapons.
12. Training Support Group For the training to work to its fullest advantage, and to take into account the different levels of experience between units, LWC are requested to nominate a unit, (preferably with recent NI experience) to support the training over the period 12-23 May. In outline this must include:
 - a. Patrol Skills and PO Course Period 12-16 May. OIC plus 6 SNCOs to deliver Training, plus Admin party. To run course for bulk of 19 Mech Bde at Catterick working to OPTAG lesson plans. Once nominated it is essential that the OIC join the Catterick recce and liaise over lesson plans
 - b. Patrol Skills and PO Course Period 19-23 May. OIC plus 6 SNCOs to deliver Training, Admin party. To run course for 1 x Sqn of the LD at Swanton Morley working to OPTAG lesson plans.
 - c. Inf Training Teams x 2 period 19-23 May. To assist 40 Regt RA and 38 Regt RE. Each team, of 1 Offr and 3 SNCOs, would logically be drawn from those involved in delivering the Patrol Skills and PO Course the previous week.
 - d. Inf Training Team period 26-30 May(TBC). To Assist LD. Team, of 1 Offr and 3 SNCOs, would logically be drawn from those involved in delivering the Patrol Skills and PO Course the previous week.

e. Patrol Search Course Period 12-16 May 3 JNCO (must have recently attended the OPTAG Patrol Search Course). Will deliver training under OPTAG RE QMSI for bulk of 19 Inf Bde at Catterick

f. Patrol Search Course Period 19 - 23 May 3 JNCO (must have recently attended the OPTAG Patrol Search Course). Will deliver training under OPTAG RE QMSI to LDs at Swanton Morley

g. Team Medics Course x 4 Period 12 - 16 May. 8 x RAMC CMT 2 (BIT Trained) instructors, 2 to run each course. Training delivered to 1 KOSB, 1 QLR, 1 KINGS, 40 Regt RA and 38 Regt RE. Overall OIC must visit OPTAG, ideally on Tue 6 May but no later than 7 May. POC is Capt [REDACTED] ATN 94281 2225 or Sgt [REDACTED] ATN 94281 2070.

ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT

If this is not practical then WO Pres should be notified of the estimated time of arrival. Speakers should note that time is limited so it is essential that all are punctual.

12. Dress. All military speakers are to wear uniform.

INTERNAL SECURITY PATROL SKILLS AND PUBLIC ORDER COURSE

INTRODUCTION

1. Background. This 3 day course will be run on behalf of OPTAG by a team provided by 1 RGBW. The emphasis will be on teaching Tactics, Techniques and Procedures (TTPs) in the form of Train the Trainer (T3). The approach will be to explain the format of the lesson, how it was set up and give instructional hints on how best deliver it, then give the lesson and finally issue students with lesson plans and other supporting documentation to allow them to replicate the training in barracks.
2. Aim. The aim of this course is to equip selected unit personnel with the knowledge and supporting aids to allow them to cascade training within the unit.
3. Attendance. It is proposed that the course is attended by a total of 3 SNCO and Junior Officers per sub unit, all of whom must be capable of cascading the training on return to unit. The course will be approximately 80 strong. All personnel must have attended the OPTAG all ranks briefing held on Mon 12 May 03.

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OP TELIC PATROL SEARCH INSTRUCTORS COURSE

GENERAL

1. Introduction. The Operational Training Advisory Group (OPTAG) are to conduct a Patrol Search Course for OP TELIC prior to 19 Mech Bde deployment to Iraq. Responsibility for the course lies with WO2 SP Giles RE, RESA OPTAG.
2. Aim. The aim of the course is to train selected JNCOs in Patrol Search procedures to enable them to return to their Unit and conduct training for the unit prior to deploying to theatre.
3. Training Objectives. The Training Objectives are at Appendix 1 as agreed by the Chief Instructor of OPTAG.
4. Conduct of the Training. A detailed training programme can be found at Appendix 2. The training will consist of the following activities but it will be the responsibility of Commanders to utilise the skills learned as applicable to their theatre of operations:
 - a. The Threat.
 - b. Search Equipment.
 - c. Search Documentation.
 - d. Person Search.
 - e. Vehicle Search.
 - f. Rummage.
 - g. Route / VP Check.
 - h. 5 and 20m Checks.
 - i. Occupied House Search.
 - j. Use of AES Dogs. ✕
5. Student TP's. On Day Three of the course, students will deliver teaching practices (TP's) as confirmation that knowledge has been assimilated. Evening study will be required.
6. In Barracks Training (IBT). Throughout the duration of the course, direction and advice will be given to the students to enable him/her to train the remainder of their sub unit in patrol search skills during their in barrack training phase. A suggested IBT programme can be found at Appendix 4.

ADMINISTRATIVE REQUIREMENTS

7. Attendance. It is important that individuals attending the course are capable of cascading the training they receive. All students must be BIT / MOI trained and minimum rank of LCpl. Any previous search experience would be beneficial. It is recommended that 3 JNCO's per sub unit attend. HQ 19 Inf Bde are responsible for course loading.
8. Location of Training. The training will be conducted atto follow..... and at training areas within the local area.
9. Accommodation. Accommodation is to be made under unit arrangements.
10. Rations. Students are to collect Norwegian containers of tea/coffee on each morning / lunch of the course prior to the start of instruction.
11. Classroom Requirement. The requirements for the classroom are at Appendix 3.
12. Instructors. Instruction will be provided by OPTAG RESA assisted by Sgt Beseyni and 3 x JNCO's from 1 RGBW. The minimum requirement for the course will be for two RESAs. A Dog Handler will also be required as detailed at Appendix 2.
13. Lesson Plans. Lesson Plans held by RESA OPTAG will on completion of the course be issued to a nominated person from each unit to assist with training. A suggested In Barracks Training (IBT) programme can be found at Appendix 4.
14. Dress / Equipment. Dress and equipment for the duration of the course will be:
 - a. Cbt 95 clothing.
 - b. Waterproof / warm clothing.
 - c. Notebook and stationary.
15. Vehicle Requirement. Units should ensure that students are self supporting for transport.
