JUDGMENT

The judgment of the Tribunal is that:

- 1. The claimant's claim for unpaid wages succeeds. The respondent is to pay to Mrs Watling £2750 forthwith for unpaid commission payments;
- 2. The claimant's complaint that the respondent has failed to pay employer and employee contributions into her pension fund is outside the jurisdiction of the Tribunal and should be referred to the Pensions Regulator;

3. The claimant's claim for statutory maternity pay for the remaining two months of her maternity leave cannot be recovered by way of a claim for unpaid wages in the circumstances of this case.

Name of Mrs K Watling v EMS case(s):

The Employment Tribunals (Interest) Order 1990 provides that sums of money payable as a result of a judgment of an Employment Tribunal (excluding sums representing costs or expenses), shall carry interest where the full amount is not paid within 14 days after the day that the document containing the tribunal's written judgment is recorded as having been sent to parties. That day is known as "the relevant decision day". The date from which interest starts to accrue is called "the calculation day" and is the day immediately following the relevant decision day.

The rate of interest payable is that specified in section 17 of the Judgments Act 1838 on the relevant decision day. This is known as "the stipulated rate of interest" and the rate applicable in your case is set out below.
