

Dear ,

Thank you for your email dated 25 February 2018. You asked:

Does the MOD use any foam with PFC's in?

I am treating your email as a request for information in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA). A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence (MOD), and I can confirm that information in scope of your request is held.

In my letter to you dated 23 January 2018 (FOI2018/13715) I advised that: 'In April 2015, Team Leidos was chosen by the MOD as the Delivery Partner to deliver the Logistic Commodities and Services Transformation programme. A 13-year contract, worth approximately £6.7bn was signed with UK-based Prime Contractor Leidos Europe Ltd to provide procurement and inventory management of commodity items (food, medical and general stores, clothing, oils, lubricants and gases) alongside storage of non-explosive inventory, and distribution and freight services for all inventory a task then undertaken by Defence Equipment and Support. As part of the procurement function, Team Leidos manage the procurement of two types of fire supressing foam. The first is used by UK Armed Forces, mainly the RAF, and is designed for training purposes, while the second is used in fire extinguishers found in office spaces, kitchens etc. and is widely used across the MOD for firefighting.'

Of the range of fire extinguishers procured through Team Leidos, two hand held extinguishers use foam that contain PFCs; this represents less than 1% of the total construct of the foam.
