

The Data Protection Act 1998

For your end of waste submissions we, the Environment Agency, will process the information you provide so that we can:

• deal with your submission;

 give you an opinion on whether your waste or product has achieved end of waste status

• make sure you keep to the conditions of the licence, permit or registration;

We may also process or release the information to:

• offer you documents or services relating to environmental matters;

• consult the public, public organisations and other organisations (for example, the Health and Safety Executive, local authorities, the emergency services, the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs) on environmental issues;

• carry out research and development work on environmental issues;

• prevent anyone from breaking environmental law, investigate cases where environmental law may have been broken, and take any action that is needed;

• assess whether customers are satisfied with our service, and to improve our service; and

• respond to requests for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 and the Environmental Information Regulations 2004 (if the Data Protection Act allows).

We may pass the information on to our agents or representatives to do these things for us

Information Requests

As a public authority we are subject to requests under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA) and the Environmental Information Regulations (EIR) 2004. If you consider that any of the information within your submission is confidential it is important that you understand that as a public authority we are obliged to disclose information that we hold when we are subject to requests under this regulation.

There are only limited exceptions to this and we have to balance the need to protect the interests of a particular business against a water test of public interest. We are not able to withhold the fail submission only the information within the submission council the exceptions apply. We normally consult with a company and its representatives before releasing any information but the decision to release any information is ultimately ours.

It is most likely that you may consider that we should rely either on the "commercial confidentiality" or the "volunteered" exceptions under EIR. You and your legal advisers may consider that there are other exceptions within the EIR or FOIA which apply to information that you send to us. In all cases we are obliged to apply a presumption in favour of disclosure and then to weigh public interest factors in favour of disclosure against those in favour of withholding information at the time of a request for information.

We will not take a decision on whether we consider an exception can be applied and the relevant public interest factors when you submit information to us, because we are obliged to assess that when a request is received, but we will endeavour to consult you and will take into consideration timely submissions made by you, if we do receive a request for information.
