

NOTICE OF ORDER

WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981 SECTION 53

Suffolk County Council
(Gipping Rural District Definitive Map and Statement) (Parish of Needham Market)
Modification Order 2017

Notice is hereby given that the above referenced Order has been submitted to the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for determination. An Inspector will be appointed by the Secretary of State to determine the Order.

The **start date** for the above Order is 11 April 2018.

Consideration of the Order will take the form of a public local inquiry.

The Inquiry will be held at **Needham Market Internet Community Café, School Street, Needham Market, Suffolk IP6 8BB on Tuesday 18 September 2018** at 10.00am.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to modify the Definitive Map and Statement for the area by adding the following two public footpaths in Needham Market, as shown on the order map:

- (1) From a footway leading from Hargrave Avenue at Ordnance Survey Grid Reference (OSGR) 60896,25453 in an easterly direction for 49 metres to the footway on the western side of Barking Road (B1078) at OSGR 60901,25453.
- (2) From a footway leading from Hargrove Avenue at (OSGR) 60896,25453, in a north easterly and then a northerly direction for 44 metres, to the footway on the southern side of Chainhouse Road at OSGR 80898,25457.

Timetable for sending in statements of case and proofs of evidence

Within 8 weeks of the start date by [by 6 June 2018]

The Order Making Authority must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send a copy (excluding copies of any supporting documents - these will be available to view at the Authority's offices) to everyone who has made an

objection or representation and the applicant and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order.

Within 14 weeks of the start date [by 18 July 2018]

Everyone who has made an objection or representation and anyone who wishes to give evidence at the Inquiry must ensure their statement of case¹ is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send full copies to the Authority. Copies will also be sent to the applicant, every person who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order (excluding copies of any supporting documents - these will be available to view at the Authority's offices).

Within the same period the applicant (if applicable) must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send a full copy to the Authority. Copies will also be sent to everyone who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order (excluding copies of any supporting documents - these will be available to view at the Authority's offices).

4 weeks before the date of the inquiry [by 21 August 2018]

The Authority, everyone who has made an objection or representation, the applicant (if applicable) and anyone who wishes to give evidence at the Inquiry must ensure their proof of evidence (together with any summary) is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send copies of:

- i) the Authority's proof of evidence to everyone who has made an objection or representation, the applicant and anyone who has submitted a statement of case (excluding copies of any supporting documents – although none should be submitted with a proof of evidence);
- ii) the applicant's proof of evidence to the Authority, everyone who has made an objection or representation and anyone else who has submitted a statement of case (excluding copies of any supporting documents – although none should be submitted with a proof of evidence); and
- iii) all other proofs of evidence to the Authority, the applicant, everyone who has made an objection or representation and anyone else who has submitted a statement of case (excluding copies of any supporting documents – although none should be submitted with a proof of evidence).

All parties must keep to the timetable set out above and ensure that statements of case and proofs of evidence are received by the Secretary of State on time. Late documents will be returned.

We cannot accept any libellous, racist or abusive comments. Any documents containing such comments will be returned.

STATEMENT) (PARISH OF NEEDHAM MARKET) MODIFICATION ORDER 2017**

This Order is made by Suffolk County Council under section 53(2)(b) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 ("the Act"), because it appears to that authority that the Definitive Map and Statement for the former Rural District of Gipping in the former Administrative County of East Suffolk require modification in consequence of the occurrence of an event specified in section 53(3)(b) namely, the expiration, in relation to footpaths in the area to which the map relates, of a period such that the enjoyment by the public of the footpaths during that period raises a presumption that the footpaths have been dedicated as a public path.

The authority has consulted with every local authority whose area includes the land to which the Order relates. Suffolk County Council hereby orders that:

1. For the purpose of this Order the relevant date is 1 July 2017.
2. The Definitive Map and Statement for the former Rural District of Gipping in the former Administrative County of East Suffolk shall be modified as described in Part I and Part II of the Schedule and shown on the map attached to the Order.
3. This Order shall take effect on the date it is confirmed and may be cited as the Suffolk County Council (Gipping Rural District Definitive Map and Statement) (Parish of Needham Market) Modification Order 2017.

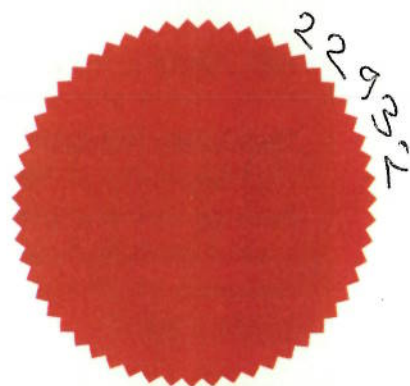

SCHEDULE

Part I: Modification of Definitive Map

Descriptions of footpaths to be added

There shall be added to the Definitive Map for the former Rural District of Gipping in the parish of Needham Market:

A footpath from a point at Ordnance Survey Grid Reference (OSGR) 60896,25453 (Point X) to a point at OSGR 60901,25453 (Point A) as shown on the attached map, and

A footpath from a point at (OSGR) 60896,25453 (Point X) to a point at OSGR 60898,25457 (Point B) as shown on the attached map.

Part II: Modification of Definitive Statement

Particulars of footpaths to be added

There shall be added to the Definitive Statement for the former Rural District of Gipping in the parish of Needham Market the following particulars:

Needham Market Footpath 20

Commencing at its junction with a footway leading from Hargrave Avenue at Ordnance Survey Grid Reference (OSGR) 60896,25453 and progressing in an easterly direction over a metalled surface for a distance of 49 metres to the footway on the western side of Barking Road (B1078) at OSGR 60901,25453.

Width: 2.5 metres

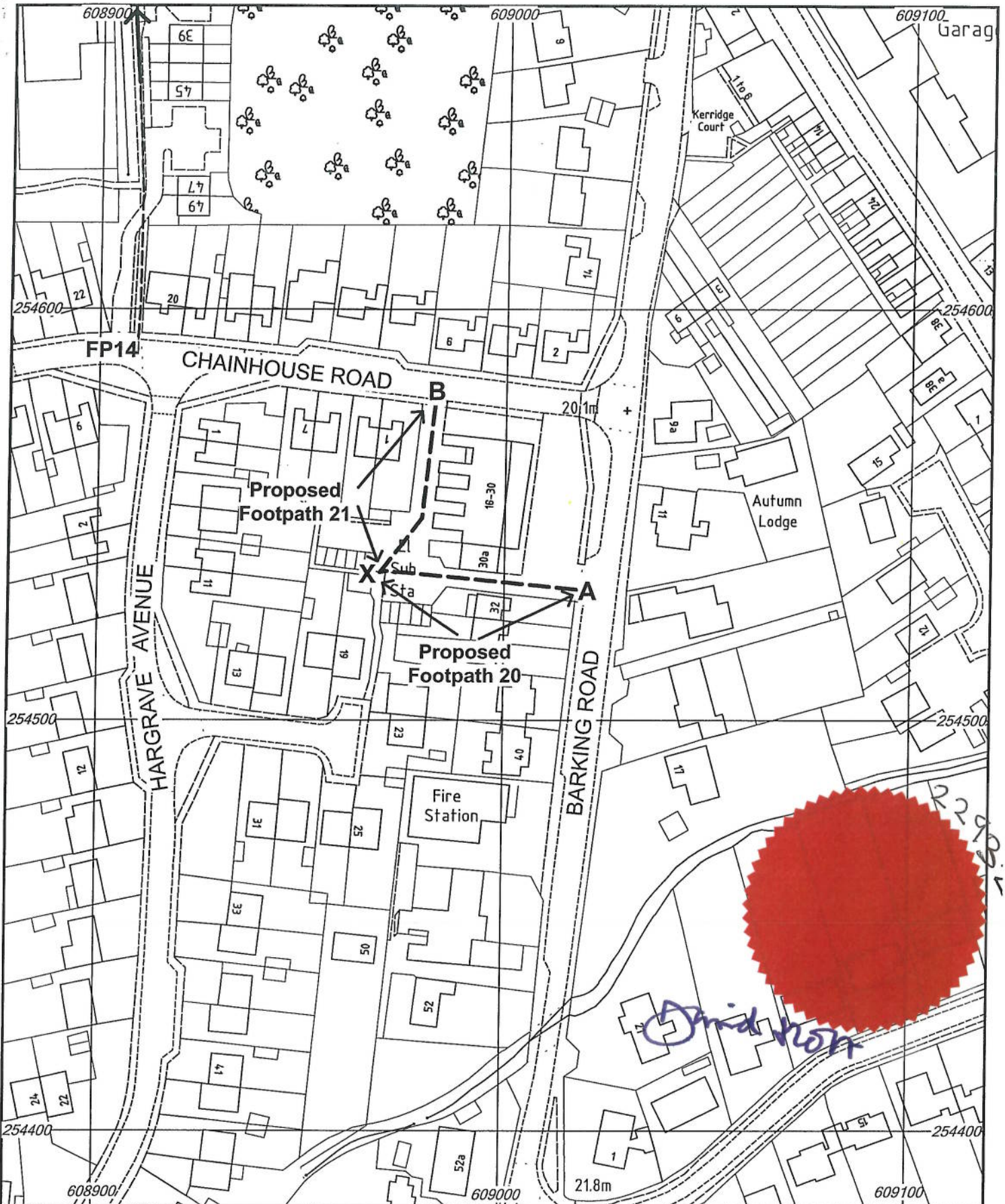
NB. Width is based on average stated in user evidence.

Needham Market Footpath 21

Commencing at its junction with a footway leading from Hargrave Avenue at Ordnance Survey Grid Reference (OSGR) 60896,25453 and progressing in a north easterly direction over a metalled surface for 17 metres to (OSGR) 60897,25454 and continuing north for a distance of 27 metres to the footway on the southern side of Chainhouse Road at OSGR 60898,25457.

Width: 5 metres
