Preliminary flood risk assessment: Hartlepool Borough Council

This addendum by Hartlepool Borough Council (2017) updates the council's preliminary flood risk assessment report published in 2011. Read the addendum in conjunction with the <u>preliminary assessment report</u>.

Addendum

The preliminary flood risk assessment (PFRA) and flood risk areas (FRAs) for Hartlepool Borough Council were reviewed during 2017, using all relevant current flood risk data and information.

There is no change to the assessment of risk following the review of the report was published in 2011.

No relevant updates are identified as a result of the 2017 review.

Past flood risk

The past flood risk from local sources has not changed from the original assessment in 2011. Localised flooding has been investigated and found to be very minor and only affecting a very low number of properties therefore in is not considered significant.

Future flood risk

The Council does not have any information that would increase the risk from the previous assessment.

Flood risk areas (FRAs)

No FRAs are identified in the Hartlepool lead local flood authority (LLFA) area for the purposes of the Flood Risk Regulations second planning cycle.

Other changes

Since the 2011 report the Council has changed from mayoral governance to a Committee system. The structure of flood risk management within the area has remained the same.
