The below table summarises contact between FCO staff (UK and locally engaged) and tobacco manufacturers in **Rwanda and Burundi** over the period in question.

<u>Rwanda</u>

The High Commissioner had a meeting in Kigali in January 2014 with the British American Tobacco local representative for Rwanda, to hear about their operations and advised that the FCO could not help.

<u>Burundi</u>

FCO staff working in and on Burundi have had the below contact with *Pacific Tobacco International* (*PTI*) since December 2013. PTI is owned by a British national. All contacts below are related to a long-running compensation claim dating back to 2004 by PTI against the government of Burundi, following PTI being evicted from their premises with some assets seized or damaged. The contacts have served to update FCO officials on the slow-moving dispute, and as occasionally appropriate, to offer assistance to try and resolve it (one formal letter and brokering occasional meetings with Burundian authorities over the period since 2013).
