


# **Criminal Justice Statistics**



### England and Wales, 2017

#### **Overview**

The number of defendants and companies formally dealt with by the Criminal Justice System in 2017 was 1.64 million, this continued the falling trend over the past decade. In the most recent year the number of defendants prosecuted fell 4% the number of out of court disposals issued fell by 14%.




### Out of court disposals

In the most recent year: the number of penalty notices for disorder fell by 28%, and the number of cautions fell by 19%



### Prosecutions and convictions


The total number of defendants prosecuted has decreased by 20% overall in the past decade, and the composition of prosecutions at the magistrates' court has changed:



Change in the number of defendants prosecuted (2007-2017)


...and the number of juveniles convicted has fallen much more steeply than adults:





#### Remands

35% of defendants tried or sentenced at the Crown Court were remanded in custody Most people (73%) remanded in custody at the Crown Court were later sentenced to immediate custody, and most (60%) remanded at the magistrates' court were then committed for trial or sentence at the Crown Court:




# Sentencing

1.20 million offenders received sentences at courts in England and Wales in 2017. Most were fines:

Community sentences continue to decline and suspended sentences have been increasing. Custody rate remains stable and average custodial sentence length is continuing to increase, this is despite a decrease in offenders being sentenced to immediate custody:






# **Motoring offences**

### Offending histories

Offenders with long criminal careers now account for over a third of the offending population, proportion of first time offenders is now at 10-year high with 13%.
