Capital Grant Claims - Requirement for Photographic Evidence

Purpose

The requirement for photographic evidence in support of all capital grant claims was introduced on 1 April 2015. The purpose of this Operations Note is to provide guidance on how to produce adequate photographic evidence. This is specific to claims that are administered by the Forestry Commission, including legacy woodland grants such as the English Woodland Grant Scheme (EWGS) and the current Countryside Stewardship (CS) Woodland Capital Grants 2015.

Background

Due to clarification of the EU Regulations relating to the Rural Development Programme for England (RDPE) evidence is required to confirm that work has been undertaken. This includes:

- Photographic evidence to support grant claims from 1 April 2015;
- Invoices for the cost of the work and all associated materials should be retained by the applicant or their agent. These must be made available on request to an Inspector, during any future inspection process.

Please note that photographic evidence is not required to support annual grant claims for Farm Woodland Payments (FWP) or Woodland Management Grants (WMG) that are being paid under a legacy grant scheme (either the Woodland Grant Scheme – WGS, or English Woodland Grant Scheme – EWGS).

Introduction

These requirements will be built into the new Countryside Stewardship Scheme (CS). However the Forestry Commission (FC) is required to introduce the requirements for:

- All existing EWGS grants for capital items only. Grants affected include Woodland Creation Grant (WCG), Woodland Improvement Grant (WIG) and Woodland Regeneration Grant (WRG);
- All capital grants agreed and claimed for under the CS Woodland Capital Grants 2015 namely support for woodland creation, tree health restoration and tree health improvement. As with EWGS, Management Plan claims do not require photographic evidence.

Concerns have been raised in relation to geo-tagging photographs, especially with regards to the equipment available at the moment and the accuracy of this equipment, particularly where a tree canopy is present. The FC and the Rural Payments Agency (RPA) have reviewed these issues. As a result of this work it has been agreed that geo-tagging remains an option but is not compulsory.

What is required?

Photographs must be numbered, in colour, focus and clearly show the capital item or feature of concern. Images should be submitted electronically via email or in exceptional circumstances via CD or USB stick. The images should be supplied as jpeg files. As a general guide digital images should not be smaller than 600 x 400 pixels and ideally the image file size no larger than 400kB.

In exceptional circumstances, printed images may be submitted. These must be no smaller than 6" x 4". Images may be supplied in either portrait or landscape orientation.

The photo needs to identify the feature or capital item concerned and more than one photograph can be submitted where the item exceeds the frame or is not evident from a single photo. Where the grant is calculated per hectare or metre photographs should be supplied that cover a representative sample of the works being funded. The number and location of photographs is dependent on the nature and size of the area covered by the grant.

For example, pictures supporting a WCG claim should clearly show the planted trees, any protection measures taken (tubes/spirals/rabbit fencing etc.), demonstrate average spacing and show examples of open ground where appropriate.

The FC may request further photographs if necessary before processing any claim, the FC will clearly identify what additional work needs to be included.

The photo must be clearly labelled and dated digital images should be saved with an appropriate file name 'grant reference_grant type_photo number_date taken' i.e. '1234_WCG_NO1_Aug 2015'. Photographs submitted as hardcopy should have the label clearly written on the reverse of the image.

The number and description of what each picture represents should be detailed in the space provided on the claim form. Alternatively this can be in a separate word document where each photograph is listed and a description given.

Identify the location from which the photograph was taken, either:

- geo-tag the photograph, this is a digital photograph that includes geographical identification metadata. This is done by assigning latitude and longitude, or another geographical reference to the image. This is most commonly carried out using a camera with a built-in GPS receiver, a function that is available on many camera phones or;
- 2. mark the number of the photo on an accompanying OS map, also note the direction in which it was taken and provide an 8 figure grid reference (example provided below).

Some standard cost items are exempt from the requirement for photographic evidence. This is only the case where a photograph cannot be used as evidence that the work has been carried out (time based elements such as L1 Forest Craftsperson). There are certain items that can't easily be photographed this includes C7 deer control landscape scale, V7 asulox, V8 stump treatment and V17 rhododendron spray for these items the photo needs to show the overall outcome rather than the activity being undertaking. For A12 and A13 leaflet production and A18 safety inspection a copy of the document produced should be provided in place of a photograph. Annex 1 of this operation note clearly lists the standard costs that must have photographic evidence to support a claim and those that are exempt.

Please note:

Photographic evidence

The FC is unable to process any capital claim for grant without the supporting evidence being provided by the applicant or their agent. We have no discretion in this respect.

Invoices

Retain invoices for all work for which you intend to claim grant in the event that FC or RPA staff request to see such supporting evidence at a future date, such as an on-site inspection.
