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Annex 5 Glossary of terms

Glossary

A list of technical or special words used in the document, with definitions.

Mental Health Issue	<p>Mental health issue (MHI) is a broader term that includes those who:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• have Mental Health Conditions;• are post-treatment;• have elevated but not clinical levels of a symptom (for example, the experience of unemployment);• have symptoms but may not recognise they have a condition,• are aware of their condition or situation but choose not to disclose; and,• individuals with MHIs who are found to struggle with their job search.
Common Mental Health Conditions	<p>Common mental health conditions (CMHCs) are the most commonly occurring mental health disorders. CMHCs include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• depression;• generalised anxiety disorder;• panic disorder;• obsessive-compulsive disorder (OCD);• post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD);and,• social anxiety disorder. <p>Research indicates CMHCs may affect up to 15% of the population at any time and around 25% of the unemployed (JSA) population (see McManus et al., 2012).</p> <p>There is considerable variation in the severity and duration of common mental health disorders, but all can be associated with significant long-term disability. Depression and anxiety disorders can have a long-term course of relapse and remission</p>



Provision Start	DWP will consider a claimant starts Provision when they attend their reception interview and agree to join provision.
Course start	<p>To be a verified course start on this provision the following needs to take place:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The Participant attends the Group Work “JOBS II” Programme on day one;• sign the attendance register; and,• completes the 6 psychological wellbeing and jobsearch measures questionnaires except where consent is withheld <p>If this process has been adhered to the Provider may record a Course Start Outcome on Provider Referral and Payment (PRaP</p> <p>Providers will be notified in advance by the district Single Point of Contact (SPoC) if the Participant has refused to allow their data to be used in the trial and/or does not wish to complete the 6 psychological wellbeing and jobsearch measures questionnaires.</p> <p>However, if the participant has refused to consent to their data being used then the Provider may register a course start on PRaP if the participant has signed the attendance register on day one.</p>
Completer	<p>Providers are asked to input participant exit information onto PRaP when that person has left the course. See chapter 10 for details of PRaP requirements.</p> <p>The Department expects the Provider to notify the district SPoC by close of business on the same day if a participant leaves or does not attend.</p>
