We consider our staff to be our greatest asset. We are fully committed to providing the means for each staff member to offer their views; to listening to what they have to say and to act on their suggestions. Staff are able to provide feedback and offer suggestions in the following ways:

- The Senior Leadership Team (SLT) engage in the 360-degree feedback scheme which allows staff working for them to leave honest feedback and comments anonymously.
- Wales Office staff participate in the annual Civil Service People Survey which allows them
  to offer their thoughts on a wide variety of departmental issues from leadership strategy
  to learning & development opportunities. The results of the survey are discussed by the
  whole office and SLT act to tackle the issues raised.
- The Wales Office has a robust whistleblowing policy and there are nominated whistleblowing officers that staff are aware of and can contact, including a designated member of the Wales Office Executive Board.
- As a small department staff are aware that they can write to the Director or any other member of the SLT with any feedback or suggestions that they might have.
