Thank you for your enquiry of 12 April 2018, which we have considered under the terms of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the FOI Act).

You asked for the following information:

"For the years 2012 to 2017 inclusive please let me know, year by year, the amount raised by HM Treasury from each of the following taxes on motorists:

Vehicle Excise Duty Hydrocarbon oil duty, usually referred to as fuel tax VAT on fuel tax."

I can confirm that HM Treasury holds some information within the scope of your request. Information on revenues from Vehicle Excise Duty (VED) and fuel duty is publicly available from the Economic and Fiscal Outlook, which is published by the Office for Budget Responsibility (OBR) on their website:

The table below, which is based on the OBR's published data, sets out the revenue from VED and fuel duty for the years requested:

However, HM Revenue and Customs (HMRC) does publish the annual VAT liabilities from each trade sector as defined by the 'Standard Industrial Classification of Economic Activities'.
