New Management Plan Service Standard launches

Our new Service Standard launches today

After a successful pilot in the South East and London Area a new Service Standard is launched in which we will aim to review 80% of first draft management plans and either approve or return with comments within 7 weeks.

- The 7 week timeframe begins when we receive the plan and ends when the plan is Approved in Principle (not including Felling Licence)
- In peak Countryside Stewardship workload times we will be less likely to meet the 7 weeks. 80% within 7 weeks is average over the year
- This isn't about lighter touch reviews your plan must meet <u>UK Forestry</u> <u>Standard</u> (UKFS)
- Feedback will include reasons why plans have not met UKFS requirements and we expect these issues to be addressed in the next draft
- We want to aim for a maximum of 2 iterations of the plan whenever possible
- A pre-visit with a Woodland Officer (and on SSSI ideally also with Natural England) can be requested to try and ensure a better quality of plan is being submitted as a first draft

Please visit the <u>Management Plan page</u> of our website to find detailed guidance on writing a management plan as well as 3 example management plans, plus our updated Woodland Management Plan template and <u>Inventory and Plan of Operations</u>.

We would like to approve as many plans as possible at first draft – the most common reasons why we can't approve are:

- Incorrect plan template used
- Poor quality of mapping or required suite of maps not supplied
- Inventory not completed and Plan of Operations incorrect (or template modified and corrupted)

- Not linking aims and objectives to management activity
- Not adequately surveying and describing the woodland and not taking account of features
- Failure to improve resilience of woodland structure and species composition
- Not considering tree health now and in the future or consider and act on other threats to the woodland
- Lack of information about consultation with all relevant stakeholders or how their responses have been considered
- Monitoring programme inadequate or missing

The service standard will apply to plans received by our Admin Hubs from 3 April 2018. Area teams will also be engaging with agents and land managers to support the rollout of the service standard and ensure plans meet the required standard.

Countryside Stewardship Woodland Tree Health Grant – Updated Manual for 2018

The <u>Countryside Stewardship Woodland Tree Health Grant manual</u> and <u>application forms</u> including annex 4 have now been updated and will apply to all agreements commencing from 1 May 2018.

This edition of the manual makes a number of <u>small changes</u> and expands the grant offer to provide support under the Woodland Tree Health Restoration grant for infection with sweet chestnut blight. Other changes are mainly updates and clarifications to bring the manual in line with other CS grant manuals. The grant's terms and conditions have not changed.

European Protected Species Training

Aimed at updating woodland agents, contractors and owners in changes to the legislation and good practice guidance, the training will help ensure woodland work can continue whilst keeping within the legislation. The training will be delivered by FC staff and species experts, and will comprise of both indoor and outdoor sessions. Woodland Creation Design Workshops

Hosted by the Forestry Commission and ICF

This series of workshops jointly hosted by the Forestry Commission and ICF will provide practical information and advice on how to design new woodlands that fit within the landscape and accommodate features of interest. Each workshop will go through the different stages of the design process based on the principles set out in the UK Forestry Standard. Delegates will gain a clear understanding of Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA). regulations for afforestation, including the information land managers need to gather and how this can be obtained. There will also be the opportunity to put any questions you might have to Forestry Commission staff.

In preparation for the workshops delegates will be asked to complete and return an EIA enquiry form based on an example site. Guidance will be provided on how to complete the activity, which should take no more than 1 hour. During the workshop delegates will continue to work through the case study to produce a Woodland Creation Design Plan. In addition to the workshop activity presentations will be given on choosing an appropriate site, species selection and operational plans.

Tickets are £49 for the day and include lunch and refreshments. Registration is mandatory and booking is open to all (ICF members and non-members), please see the ICF website to book.
