#### Conclusion

In account of the evidence, officials conclude it would be appropriate for the Secretary of State to enter into the Funding Agreement with the academy trust. Overall, the unique nature of the type of provision and specialisms of the proposed UTC will ensure that there will be limited direct competition with individual schools and colleges. The uniqueness of the educational provision in advanced manufacturing and engineering will improve parental and pupil choice and diversify the school landscape within the region. As the UTC's catchment extends across eight local authorities, we expect it to have a diffuse impact, whereby a large number of secondary schools and providers each lose a relatively small number of pupils to the new UTC. We do not expect the establishment of the UTC to threaten the long term viability of the majority of institutions, but the increased risk of a negative impact on Leeds City Academy and Leeds East Academy should be noted.
