Community Life Survey: Formal Volunteering

This factsheet summarises official statistics on formal volunteering at least once a month and at least once in the last year by adults (16+) in England, based on data from the 2017-18 Community Life Survey

Formal Volunteering is defined here as giving unpaid help through clubs or organisations.

These rates are slightly lower than in 2013-14.





Monthly volunteering was similar among men and women, but women were more likely than men to have volunteered once in the last year.

Adults living in Rural areas were more likely to volunteer formally...




Adults living in the least deprived areas were more likely to formally volunteer than those living in the most deprived areas...






Formal monthly volunteering was least prevalent among the 25-34 age group...


