## Final migration of Forestry Commission content to GOV.UK has happened

**The Forestry Commission website has now moved to GOV.UK**

On Wednesday 26 September 2018, we completed the transfer of content from our old website to [www.GOV.UK/forestrycommission](http://www.GOV.UK/forestrycommission). Use our homepage to access links to our most important and frequently used guidance, or use the search facility on GOV.UK or Google to search for other items.

### Key items that we moved in this final phase:

- Tree Health England: information on identifying, reporting and managing a tree pest or disease
- Cross Border Plant Health: guides relating to identifying a tree pest or disease, and the import and export of wood and timber products

As well as a stand, which had staff on hand to provide advice on grants, guidance, regulations, Tree Health and biosecurity, and to demonstrate the new Felling Licence Online

service, we also held several seminars to discuss these subjects further. On Thursday 20, the [Action Plan for Climate Change Adaptation](#) was launched at our stand by Sir Harry Studholme, Chair of the Forestry Commission, and the Tree Champion Sir William Worsley, alongside the Forestry Climate Change Working Group.
