Declaration of Receipt of an Annex A Specimen by way of Gift or Unconditional Loan

This form should be used to declare that a specimen listed in Annex A to the EC CITES Regulations 338/97 and 865/2006 was acquired by way of gift or unconditional loan and where no commercial transaction took place.

For the purposes of this declaration:

- 'gift' or 'unconditional loan' shall mean the passing of the specimen to the person making the declaration in such a way that no commercial transaction takes place
- 'commercial transaction' shall mean any form of reciprocal agreement including sale, exchange, hire, barter or conditional breeding loan
- 'barter' includes any arrangement to share future commercial benefit from the specimen or any offspring produced by it.
