Thank you for your email of 27 April clarifying FOI2018/05423. You have now requested the following information:

'1. Whether there were black African nationality individuals who commissioned as officers in the British Army before August 2003 (ie, from RMA Sandhurst), how many there were, and from which countries they came?

2. Whether there were black Zimbabwean nationality individuals who commissioned as officers in the British Army before August 2003 (ie, from RMA Sandhurst), and - if so - how many there were?

3. How many Zimbabwean officers there are in the British Army at present, and how many of those are black?

\*\*\*The above questions relate to people of Zimbabwean nationality, and/or other African nationality, and - not those with a Black African ethnicity in general (ie, not Black African ethnicity people with British citizenship)

4. How many black African officers there are in the British Army at present?

5. How many black officers (Caribbean or African heritage) are in the British Army at present?

\*\*The above two questions relate to anyone declaring Black African ethnicity, whatever their nationality might be (ie,, including British nationals, and the nationals of other non-African countries).'

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) 2000. A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence, and I can confirm that information in scope of your request is held and is detailed in the tables below.

Please note that:

• Figures are comprised of trade trained Regular Army Officers only, and therefore exclude Gurkhas, Full Time Reserve Service, Mobilised Reserves, Army Reserve and all other Reserves. British Army Soldiers have also been excluded.

- Figures comprise of nationality and ethnicity as recorded on the Personnel Administrative Systems. Nationality is that recorded at the date presented and is not necessarily their nationality at birth or when recruited.
- Nationality is not recorded in the data held before 1997.
- The data has been rounded to the nearest 5 to limit disclosure and ensure confidentiality. Totals and sub-totals have been rounded separately and so may not appear to be the sum of their parts.
- "~" represents fewer than 5
- "-" denotes zero

## Table 1: British Army Officers with an African nationality by ethnicity type serving on 1stApril 1997-2003 (Question 1)

This table includes African Officers who were on strength at the 1 April of each year recorded. However, they may have commissioned at any point prior to this date. Additionally, this means the same people could be recorded on strength across all yearly points. African nationalities recorded include; Egyptian, Ghanaian, Kenyan, Nigerian, Sierra Leone, South Africa, Sudanese, Ugandan and Zimbabwean. Black nationalities have been grouped into the ethnic grouping of 'black', and White, Unknown and Other nationalities have been grouped into 'Other'.
