IV. Health Information

- I, the undersigned, certify that the birds described above meet the following requirements:
- a) being within 48 hours prior to export, I have examined all the birds for export and found no signs of infectious or contagious disease, and in my opinion the birds are fit for the intended journey;
- b) no outbreak of Newcastle disease, notifiable avian influenza, pigeon paramyxovirus, nor any other notifiable disease of poultry has been confirmed within 50 kms of the premises of origin at paragraph II. (b) above during the past 6 months;
- c) the birds have completed a thirty (30) day isolation period under Defra supervision, and during this period there have been no outbreaks of contagious disease in the premises of origin;
- d) within 14 days prior to export samples were collected from the bird(s) for export and the samples were submitted to the Veterinary Laboratories Agency (VLA), Weybridge, where they were tested for avian influenza (H5 and H7 subtypes) with negative results in each case as shown below, and a copy of the laboratory report is attached:

EITHER*:

(i) blood samples from each bird were submitted to the AGID / HI / ELISA test* for antibodies to avian influenza;

OR* :

(ii) faecal/cloacal swabs from the birds were tested by virus isolation / PCR test* for avian influenza virus; e) EITHER*(i) on (date), being within 14 days of shipment, blood samples were collected from the birds and submitted to the Veterinary Laboratory Agency (VLA), Weybridge where they were submitted to the following test with negative results in each case:

- f) the birds for export have been treated for avian psittacosis with a tetracycline preparation for 14 days prior to export according to the manufacturer's instructions

- k) I have received a written declaration from the owner/exporter
 that:
 - (i) the birds will be transported directly from the place of origin at paragraph II (b) to the airport of departure without coming into contact with any other birds of a lesser health status;
 - (ii) the birds will be packed for export in clean, new containers;
 - (iii) the birds will be shipped directly to Barbados and will not be transhipped without the written agreement of the Senior Veterinary Officer of Barbados.

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V. This certificate is valid for 10 days; in the case of transport by ship the period of validity is extended by the length of the voyage.
