- the said animals have been kept at an approved institution which ensures that these primates for export to South Africa have not been in contact with primates of a lesser health status or new introductions of primates for 45 days prior to export to South Africa (pre-export isolation);

(k) I have received a written declaration from the owner/exporter stating that the said animals will be transported in containers constructed in accordance with recognised International Air Transport Association (I.A.T.A.) standards, being either new containers, or containers which have been cleansed and disinfected before use with a disinfectant approved by the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs.
