- a) the said meat was obtained under conditions governing production and control laid down in European Community legislation on health problems affecting intra-community trade in fresh meat;
- b) the animals from which the meat was obtained were subjected to antemortem inspection under official veterinary supervision where no clinical evidence of notifiable infectious or contacious disease was noted;
- c) the animals from which the meat was derived were examined under official veterinary supervision immediately after slaughter and found fit for human consumption in accordance with legislation currently in force in the European Union (EU);
- d) the animals were slaughtered and the meat prepared in an establishment approved for trade within the EU;
- e) the animals from which the meat was derived originate from holdings on which no case of an OIE list A disease to which the species of origin is susceptible has been confirmed at the time of slaughter;

- f) the meat has been produced, handled, stored and transported within the EU in accordance with EU hygiene legislation;
- g) the meat is oval marked to denote that it is acceptable for human consumption in the United Kingdom;
- h) no case of an OIE list A disease to which the species of origin is susceptible has been confirmed in the United Kingdom during the last 12 months.
