- 1. they originated from farms that are free from prohibitions resulting from an outbreak of any disease listed on the former list A of the OIE Code to which the species is susceptible;
- 2. they were derived from animals which have been subjected to ante-mortem and post-mortem inspection under veterinary supervision in an EU-approved slaughterhouse and found free from any clinical evidence of infectious or contagious disease;
- 3. they have been inspected and found to be fit for human consumption;4. the establishments at which the products described above were processed / manufactured are approved by the competent authorities of the United Kingdom in accordance with current hygiene legislation;
- 5. they have been oval marked, handled, packed, stored and transported in accordance with legislation currently in force in the United Kingdom and have been kept free from contamination prior to export;
- 6. On the basis of the legislation currently in force in the United Kingdom and the United Kingdom's surveillance programme for residues in meat, it can be considered that the meat does not contain harmful levels of any veterinary medicine, including anti-microbial substances, nor any beta agonist or substances having a thyrostatic, oestrogenic, androgenic or gestogenic action which do not occur naturally in the meat, or residues, exceeding the limits permitted in the United Kingdom of veterinary medicines for heavy metal contaminants;
- 7. The animals from which the meat or meat products originate were not treated with any growth hormone;
- 8. According to EU regulations, no harmful preservatives harmful colorant agents have been added to the meat and meat pro
