EXPORT OF FRESH MEAT/MEAT PREPARATIONS FROM BIUNGULATE ANIMALS (EXCLUDING BOVINES) TO MACAO - 7675EHC

NOTES FOR THE GUIDANCE OF THE OFFICIAL VETERINARIAN

IMPORTANT

These notes provide guidance to Official Veterinarians (OVs) and exporters and should have been issued to you together with export certificate 7675EHC. These Notes for Guidance (NFG) are not intended to operate as a standalone document but in conjunction with certificate 7675EHC.

Exporters are strongly advised to verify the requirements of the importing country by contacting the veterinary authorities, or their representatives in the UK, in advance of each consignment.

1. SCOPE OF THE CERTIFICATE

Export health certificate 7675EHC may be used for the export of meat/meat preparations of biungulate origin (excluding beef products) from the United Kingdom to Macao.

The meat and meat preparations must have been derived from animals which were slaughtered on or after 19 February 2014, as agreed by the United Kingdom (UK) authorities and the Government of Macao Special Administrative Region.

2. CERTIFICATION BY AN OFFICIAL VETERINARIAN

This certificate may be signed by a Veterinary Officer of the Department or a Local Veterinary Inspector (LVI) appointed by the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (Defra), the Scottish Government, the Welsh Government or by an Authorised Veterinary Inspector (AVI) appointed by the Department of Agriculture and Rural Development, Northern Ireland (DARD), who is an Official Veterinarian (OV) on the appropriate export panel for export purposes.

OVs must sign and stamp the health certificate with the OV stamp in any ink colour **OTHER THAN BLACK**.

A certified copy of the completed certificate must be sent to the Animal Health and Veterinary Laboratories Agency (AHVLA) Centre for International Trade at Carlisle within seven days of signing, or in the case of Northern Ireland to DARD, Dundonald House, Belfast.

The OV should keep a copy for his/her own records.

3. ORIGIN OF THE MEAT/MEAT PREPARATIONS

Macao requires that meat and meat preparations exported from the United Kingdom are of **UK origin only**, i.e. the animals were slaughtered, and the meat cut and, where applicable, processed entirely in the UK.

4. HEALTH INFORMATION

Paragraphs IV (a), (c) and (d) can be certified on the basis of the EU oval mark and evidence that the slaughterhouse, cutting plant, meat products plant (if applicable) and cold store are officially approved and operating in accordance with Regulations (EC) Nos. 852/2004, 853/2004 and 854/2004, as transposed into national

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legislation. .

- 5. Paragraph IV (b) refers to the Bovine Spongiform Encephalopathy (Amendment) Order 1996, which came into force on 29 March 1996.
- 6. Paragraph IV (e) may be certified on the basis of the results of the national surveillance scheme for residues, which EU approved meat establishments are subjected to. The national surveillance scheme implements Council Directives 96/22/EC and 96/23/EC and the HACCP requirements in Regulation (EC) 854/2004 also places an obligation on all EU approved meat establishments to ensure compliance with these Directives. These Directives are transposed into national legislation by The Animals and Animal Products (Examinations for Residues and Maximum Limits) Regulations 1997..

7. PRODUCTS INTENDED FOR RETAIL SALE

The Macao authorities require that if the products are to be distributed to retail outlets in Macao, they need to be pre- packaged and labelled showing the name and address of the slaughtering plant and the date of slaughter of the food animal concerned.

8. DISCLAIMER

This certificate is provided on the basis of information available at the time and may not necessarily comply fully with the requirements of the importing country. It is the exporter's responsibility to check the certificate against any relevant import permit or any advice provided by the competent authority in the importing country.
