#### EXPORT OF FRESH POULTRY MEAT TO ST KITTS AND NEVIS - 1811EHC

#### NOTES FOR THE GUIDANCE OF THE OFFICIAL VETERINARIAN

#### IMPORTANT

These notes provide guidance to Official Veterinarians (OV) and exporters. The Notes for Guidance (NFG) should have been issued to you together with export certificate 1811EHC. The NFG should not be read as a standalone document but in conjunction with certificate 1811EHC. We strongly suggest that exporters obtain full details of the importing country's requirements from the veterinary authorities in the country concerned, or their representatives in the UK, in advance of each consignment.

#### 1. Scope of the certificate.

This certificate is for the export of fresh poultry meat to St. Kitts and Nevis.

## 2. Certification by an Official Veterinarian (OV)

This certificate may be signed by an OV appointed by the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs, the Scottish Government or the Welsh Government, who is on the appropriate panel for export purposes or who holds the appropriate Official Controls Qualification (Veterinary)(OCQ(V)) authorisation, or an Authorised Veterinary Inspector (AVI) appointed by, or an OV of, the Department of Agriculture, Environment and Rural Affairs in Northern Ireland (DAERA).

OVs/AVIs should sign and stamp the health certificate with the OV/AVIs stamp in any colour  $OTHER\ THAN\ BLACK$ .

A certified copy of the completed certificate must be sent to the issuing office (in GB - the Centre for International Trade, Carlisle) within seven days of signing, or in the case of Northern Ireland, to DAERA, Dundonald House, Belfast.

The OV/AVI should keep a copy for his/her own records.

## 3. Identification

Paragraph I (e) (i) and (ii) - The certifying veterinarian should insert both container and seal numbers.

## 4. Fitness for human consumption

Paragraph IV (a), (b), (c), (e) and (f) may be certified on the basis of oval-marks from approved slaughterhouse/s or meat products establishments which demonstrate compliance with EU Regulations (EC) 853/2004 and 854/2004.

# 5. Notifiable Disease Clearance

Paragraph IV (d) can be certified provided written authority to do so on form 618NDC has been obtained from the issuing office.

## 6. Disclaimer

This certificate is provided on the basis of information available at the time and may not necessarily comply fully with the requirements of the importing country. It is the exporter's responsibility to check the certificate against any relevant import permit or any advice provided by the competent authority in the importing country.
