JUDGMENT

- In breach of contract the claimant was dismissed without notice and he is entitled to 1 week's net pay by way of compensation. The respondent is ordered to pay the claimant the sum of one hundred and forty pounds (£140.00) net of statutory deductions
- 2. At the time of his dismissal the claimant had accrued untaken and unpaid leave amounting to 4.5 days. The respondent is ordered to pay him compensation in the sum of eighty one pounds (£81.00) net of statutory deductions
- 3. The counterclaim for the repayment of the claimant's wages fails and is dismissed
- 4. The respondent is ordered to pay the claimant a total of two hundred and twenty one pounds (£221.00)

THE EMPLOYMENT TRIBUNALS (INTEREST) ORDER 1990

Tribunal case number(s): 2421406/2017

Name of case(s): Mr J Logue v Nicole James Salon Limited

The Employment Tribunals (Interest) Order 1990 provides that sums of money payable as a result of a judgment of an Employment Tribunal (excluding sums representing costs or expenses), shall carry interest where the full amount is not paid within 14 days after the day that the document containing the tribunal's written judgment is recorded as having been sent to parties. That day is known as *"the relevant decision day"*. The date from which interest starts to accrue is called *"the calculation day"* and is the day immediately following the relevant decision day.

The rate of interest payable is that specified in section 17 of the Judgments Act 1838 on the relevant decision day. This is known as "the stipulated rate of interest" and the rate applicable in your case is set out below.
