- \* (a) the deer velvet was removed from deer after killing. The removal of velvet from live deer is prohibited in the United Kingdom;
- (b) the products are derived from carcasses which have been subjected to post-mortem veterinary inspection, and found to be free from any evidence of notifiable infectious or contagious disease including rabies, foot and mouth disease, chronic wasting disease and anthrax;
- (c) the deer from which the products originated were processed in an approved premises and passed fit for human consumption;
- (d) the products were processed and packed in a hygienic manner in a premises approved under the relevant regulations in force in United Kingdom;
- (e) based on the results of random sampling at such processing premises in the United Kingdom it can be considered that the meat does not contain residues exceeding the limits permitted within the EU, which do not occur naturally in the meat and which may have a hormonal or anti-hormonal effect;

(f) the feeding of mammalian meat & bone meal (MMBM) or dry greaves of mammalian origin to livestock has been prohibited in the United Kingdom since March 1996 by legislation;

(g) the United Kingdom (UK) is recognised by the Office International des Epizooties (OIE) as a country free from foot and mouth disease (FMD) without vaccination;

(h) the consignment is intended for Chinese medicinal purposes only.
