JUDGMENT UPON RECONSIDERATION

Employment Tribunals Rules of Procedure 2013 – Rules 21 and 70 to 72

Upon reconsideration, the Judgment made on 24 May 2018 is varied as follows:

The respondent has made unauthorised deductions from the claimant's wages in the following sums:

- a) Pay for 6 November to 1 December 2017 (authorised holiday), £2,333.00 gross
- b) 2 weeks' laying on (from start of employment), £1,166.00 gross; and
- c) December pay to 20 December 2017, £1,749.00 gross.

and the respondent is ordered to pay the claimant the gross sum of £5,248.00.

REASONS

By his letter dated 26 July 2018, the claimant sought a reconsideration of the Judgment made under Rule 21 and sent to the parties on 24 May 2018, such that the elements of the Tribunal's judgment be itemised. Accordingly, the breakdown of the total gross sum awarded on the basis of his ET1 claim form and further letter dated 21 April 2018 is set out above.
