# **REMEDY JUDGMENT**

The judgment of the Tribunal is that the claimant is awarded the following sums:

1. A Basic Award of £8,099.30 (gross pay £9.35 x 31.5 x 27.5).

#### **Compensatory Award**

2.	(i)	Loss of statutory rights	£300.00
	(ii)	26 weeks net loss of earnings	£5,928.00

3. The Recoupment Regulations do not apply.

4. Therefore, the total award payable by the respondent to the claimant within 14 days of the date of this judgment is  $\pounds14,327.30$ .

The Employment Tribunals (Interest) Order 1990 provides that sums of money payable as a result of a judgment of an Employment Tribunal (excluding sums representing costs or expenses), shall carry interest where the full amount is not paid within 14 days after the day that the document containing the tribunal's written judgment is recorded as having been sent to parties.
