To the Governor of Our prison at _____ greeting:

We command you that you have in the Queen's Bench Division [*or Family Division as the case may be*] of our High Court of Justice [*or before a judge in chambers*] at the Royal Courts of Justice, Strand, London, on the day and at the time specified in the notice served with this writ, the body of A.B. being taken and detained under your custody as is said, together with the day and cause of his being taken and detained, by whatsoever name he may be called therein, that Our Court [*or Judge*] may then and there examine and determine whether such cause is legal, and have you there then this writ.
