Thank you for your letter in which you requested the following information under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA):

break down of the costs that the army legal system used while trying to find XX guilty of a pathetic incident. I do not need exact figures of what it cost. I would like just a rough cost ie

10 RMP investigators £1000 in wages Prosecutors lawyers fees £2000 in wages Defence lawyers £2000 Court costs £10000 11 Regt eod staff wages £3000

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000. A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence, and I can confirm that some information in scope of your request is held. Some of the information is below, however some of the information is not held.

I can advise that the Military Court Service (MCS) does not maintain records of court costs of individual proceedings. However, they have been able to provide a rough costing of £450 based on an estimate of one hour's pre-trial court usage XXXXXXXX. The costing encompasses elements of Headquarters MCS and Court Centre Staff, judiciary and professional services employed by the court.

It has not been possible to produce an estimate of the cost to the Royal Military Police, 11 Explosive Ordnance Disposal Regiment and the Service Prosecuting Authority. This is because the amount of time spent on XXXXXXX by individuals in these areas is not recorded.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may raise your complaint directly to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not normally investigate your case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
