Thank you for your email of 18 September 2017 requesting the following information:

"Please detail the total litigation costs to date - MOD Vs. British Nuclear Test Veterans"

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOI Act).

I can advise you that following a search of our records, I have established that the Ministry of Defence (MOD) holds information within the scope of your request.

The information the Government Legal Department holds in relation to your request is as follows:

The total legal costs including charges and disbursements for the civil litigation and the Ionising Radiation Appeal brought by the Nuclear Test Veterans against the MOD as at 28 September 2017 is £6,236,931 (including VAT), of which the MOD has recovered £4 million (including interest and VAT) from the Claimants' 'After the Event' insurers, under costs orders made in the Department's favour in the civil litigation.
