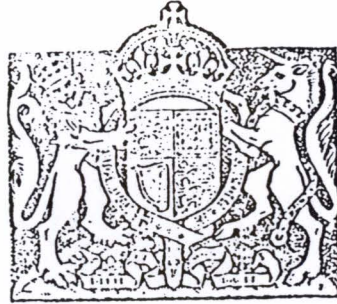

MILITARY LANDS.

BYELAWS.

Made by His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department under the provisions of the Military Lands Acts, 1892 to 1903, for regulating the use of certain War Department lands in the Aldershot ^{District} ~~Command~~, as set out in the Schedules hereto, for the purposes to which they are appropriated and for prohibiting all intrusion on such lands and all obstruction of the use thereof.

BYELAWS

Made by His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department under the provisions of the Military Lands Acts, 1892 to 1903, for regulating the use of certain War Department lands in the Aldershot ~~Command~~^{Division}, as set out in the Schedules hereto, for the purposes to which they are appropriated and for prohibiting all intrusion on such lands and all obstruction of the use thereof.

OFFENCES.

1. NO costermonger, hawker, pedlar, huckster, marine store or other dealer, or rag and bone and bottle gatherer, or book-maker, or racing or betting tout, or vendor of newspapers or any kind of literature or vendor of refreshments, or photographer, or person engaged in any similar traffic or occupation to any of those specified, or any tradesman or his agents or servants, unless in possession of a ~~Pass~~^{Pass} issued under the authority of the Major-General in Charge of Administration, Aldershot ~~Command~~^{Division}, shall intrude or enter or be upon the said War Department lands for the purpose of selling, buying or trafficking, or otherwise carrying on his or her or any like business or calling.

2. NO person shall deposit or distribute or cause to be deposited or distributed upon the said War Department lands any handbills, literature or other printed matter of any description.

3. NO person shall, without the authority of the ~~Major-General in Charge of Administration, Aldershot Command~~^{Colonel 1/a}, cause to assemble or attempt to cause to assemble upon the said War Department lands any number of persons or address any such persons when assembled.

4. NO person, without the authority of the ~~Major-General in Charge of Administration, Aldershot Command~~^{Colonel 1/a}, shall affix any posters, bills or notices of any description in or on the boundaries or walls of the said War Department lands.

5. NO person shall enter or be upon the said War Department lands for the purpose of committing a nuisance or of idling, loitering or behaving in an indecent or disorderly manner, or for the purpose of gaming, betting or wagering.

6. NO person shall enter or be upon the said War Department lands for the purpose of carrying, or of applying for permission to carry, the kits of soldiers or other persons, or of obtaining any other kind of casual employment.

7. No person shall enter or be upon the said War Department lands for the purpose of removing Cartridge Cases, lead from the Butts, or any kind of metal or other material, unless duly authorised and in possession of a Pass, issued under the authority of the ~~Major General in Charge of Administration~~, Aldershot ~~Command~~. *Colonel No. 1*

8. NO person whatever shall continue on the said War Department lands after having been warned off by an Officer or by any person acting under the authority of an Officer. Nor shall any vehicle, animal or thing be allowed to remain on the said lands after the owner, or the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall have been warned to remove the same by an Officer or any person acting under the authority of an Officer.

9. NO person, without the authority of an Officer, shall deposit broken glass or other rubbish upon the said War Department lands.

10. NO person, unless in possession of a Pass, issued under the authority of the ~~Major General in Charge of Administration~~, Aldershot ~~Command~~, shall camp, whether in tents or caravans or otherwise, or bivouac, or sleep out upon the said War Department lands. *Colonel No. 1*

11. No night walker or common prostitute shall locate herself in, or trespass on, or resort to the said War Department lands for the purpose of prostitution.

12. NO person, without the authority of the ~~Major General in Charge of Administration~~, Aldershot ~~Command~~, shall cut grass or growing crops or cut and remove turf, or use the said War Department lands for the purpose of grazing any horse, cow, sheep or other animal. *Colonel No. 1*

13. NO person, without the authority of the ~~Major General in Charge of Administration~~, Aldershot ~~Command~~, shall cut or deface any growing trees or shrubs or remove any timber, trees, shrubs, or wild flower roots from the said War Department lands, nor shall any person enter or be upon the said lands for the purpose of damaging trees or other property situated on the said lands. *Colonel No. 1*

14. NO person shall enter or be upon the said War Department lands, for the purpose of pursuing or killing game or other birds or animals, or of fishing in any waters within the said lands,

without the authority of the ~~Major General in Charge of Administration, Aldershot Command~~ ^{Colonel No}

15. NO person, without the authority of an Officer, shall light a fire on the said War Department lands for any purpose whatever; nor shall any person, by throwing down lighted or live matches or in any other way, do anything causing or tending to cause a fire to break out on the said lands.

16. NO person shall ride a horse or bicycle or drive any motor car or other vehicle upon any footpath by the side of any War Department road maintained by the War Department and situate on the said War Department lands.

17. No person, unless in possession of a Pass issued under the authority of the ~~Major General in Charge of Administration, Aldershot Command~~ ^{Colonel No} (or of the Commandant, Staff College, Camberley, in the case of that portion of Minley Manor grounds as are reserved to that Establishment), shall enter the grounds of Minley Manor and/or the woodlands and heathlands upon the Minley Estate, other than by the recognised public footpaths and bridle paths, and shall not stray from such paths.

18. No driver of a hackney carriage, taxicab or other vehicle shall enter or be upon the War Department lands for the purpose of plying for hire, without a Pass issued under the authority of the ~~Major General in Charge of Administration, Aldershot Command~~ ^{Colonel No} ~~W. H. K. C.~~

19. Subject to the restrictions contained in Byelaws Nos. 16 and 18 and subject to the restriction of the user of Transport Road, Aldershot, as indicated in the First Schedule hereto, the public may ride any horse or bicycle or drive any horse-drawn vehicle, motor car, motor cycle, or other mechanically propelled vehicle, on any road maintained by the War Department and situate on the said War Department lands, when such road is not being used for any military purpose, but in such case:—

- (i) The driver of any such motor car, motor cycle, or other mechanically propelled vehicle shall not drive on any of the roads specified in the First Schedule hereto, at a speed exceeding that indicated therein.
- (ii) The rider of any such horse or bicycle or the driver of any such horse-drawn vehicle, motor car, motor cycle, or other mechanically propelled vehicle, shall, at the request of a military policeman in uniform or of a War Department Constable in uniform, or if such military policeman or War Department Constable put up his hand as a signal for that purpose, stop and not proceed further until a signal to proceed is given.

- (iii) The rider of any such bicycle or the driver of any such horse-drawn vehicle, motor car, motor cycle or other mechanically propelled vehicle shall not ride or drive over such roads without a light between the hours of one hour after sunset and one hour before sunrise during summer time, or between the hours of half an hour after sunset and half an hour before sunrise during winter time.

The provisions of this sub-section are in addition to and not in derogation of any existing statute, local or other byelaws or regulations which may now or hereafter be in force.

- (iv) No vehicle of any description whatever exceeding twelve feet six inches in height, shall be driven under the bridge carrying a sewer pipe across the Deepcut-Pirbright Camp Road.

RIGHTS OF WAY.

20. NOTHING in these Byelaws shall affect any public right-of-way, but subject as aforesaid the expression "lands" or "War Department lands" shall include all roads on such lands.

COMMON RIGHTS.

21. NOTHING in these Byelaws shall take away or prejudicially affect any rights of Common in respect of Bramshott Common, Broxhead Common, Kingsley Common, Shorthearth Common, Yateley Common and The Slab and the Warren at Selbourne.

WAR DEPARTMENT TENANTS.

22. NOTHING in these Byelaws shall affect the rights of the tenants of the War Department under their agreements with the War Department.

CONTRAVENTION OF BYELAWS.

23. ANY person doing anything prohibited by or otherwise contravening any of the preceding Byelaws numbered 1 to 19 shall be deemed to commit an offence against the Byelaw so contravened.

OFFICERS AUTHORISED.

24. THE persons hereby authorised to remove or take into custody without warrant any person committing an offence

against any of the preceding Byelaws numbered 1 to 19 or to remove any vehicle, animal or thing found on the said War Department lands, in contravention of any of these Byelaws, are:—

- (1) The General Officer Commanding-in-Chief, Aldershot Command; *Colonel A.C.*
- (2) The Major General in Charge of Administration, Aldershot Command *Historic*;
- (3) The Officers in Charge of any of the said War Department lands;
- (4) Any Officer, Warrant Officer, Non-Commissioned Officer or any Military Policeman or War Department Constable in uniform for the time being under the command of the said General Officer Commanding-in-Chief, or Major General in Charge of Administration, Aldershot Command, or of the said Officer in Charge;
- (5) Any person authorised in writing under the hand of the said General Officer Commanding-in-Chief, or Major General in Charge of Administration, Aldershot Command, or of the said Officer in Charge; or
- (6) Any Constable.

DATE OF OPERATION OF THESE BYELAWS.

25. THESE Byelaws shall come into force at the date hereof, on and after which date the Byelaws in respect of Aldershot and District Military Lands, dated the ~~fourth~~ ^{fifteenth} day of December, One thousand nine hundred and thirty ~~two~~, shall be revoked.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

(4) Deepcut — Brunswick Road, Deepcut Barracks 30 miles an hour.

(b) One way Traffic.

(1) Aldershot, ~~Transport~~ ^{Queen's} Road—the use of that portion of ~~Transport~~ ^{Queen's} Road, Aldershot, which lies between Queen's Avenue and Alison's Road, shall be restricted to East-bound Traffic only.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

NOTICES.

PENALTY FOR OFFENCES.

1. By Section 17 (2) of the Military Lands Act, 1892, it is provided that :—

If any person commits an offence against any Byelaw under this Act he shall be liable, on conviction before a Court of Summary Jurisdiction, to a fine not exceeding FIVE POUNDS, and may be removed by any Constable or Officer authorised in manner provided by the Byelaw from the area to which the Byelaw applies, and taken into custody without warrant and brought before a Court of Summary Jurisdiction to be dealt with according to law, and any vehicle, animal or thing found in the area in contravention of any Byelaw may be removed by any Constable or such Officer as aforesaid and on due proof of such contravention, be declared by a Court of Summary Jurisdiction to be forfeited by His Majesty.
