I refer to your e-mail dated 27July 2018, which was acknowledged on 30 July 2018.

We are treating your e-mail as a request for information in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA 2000).

In your e-mail you requested the following information:

"1. The number of police officers, PCSOs or civilian staff in your police force who have resigned or retired while under investigation for misconduct, from 15 Dec 2017 to 14 July 2018 (inclusive).

And for each case:

2. A brief description of the alleged misconduct (that gives no personal details e.g. assault against civilian in custody)

- 3. If applicable, the alleged offence(s)
- 4. The misconduct outcome (if case ongoing, please state that)
- 5. If applicable, the criminal outcome
- 6. Whether the employee was put on the Police Barred List
- 7. Whether the employee was put on the Police Advisory List

8. Whether the employee is still on the Police Advisory List and if not, please include whether this is because they were moved to the Police Barred List or were removed altogether."

A search for information has now been completed by the Ministry of Defence Police and I can confirm that we do hold information in scope of your request.

2 officers have resigned whilst under investigation for misconduct between 15/12/2017 and 14/07/2018.

N.B Civilian staff in the Ministry of Defence Police are MOD civil servants and subject to Civil Service Disciplinary Procedures therefore police regulations do not apply. However there have been no civilian staff who have resigned or retired while under investigation for misconduct, from 15 Dec 2017 to 14 July 2018 (inclusive). MOD Police officers who resign while subject to gross misconduct proceedings are recorded on the Police National database "Flagstone" process since the Barred and Advisory lists only have England & Wales extent and MDP officers also serve in Scotland and Northern Ireland.
