## **JUDGMENT**

The judgment of the Tribunal is that:

- 1. The claimant's following claims are well-founded and succeed, in each case in the sums shown, as follows:
  - (1) The respondent made unauthorised deductions from the claimant's basic wages in the period 23 March 2017 to 8 January 2018 in the sum of £4,327.80 and in respect of 36 hours of overtime worked over a 17 week period in the sum of £2,142.
  - (2) The respondent failed to pay to the claimant accrued holiday pay in the sum of £371.
  - (3) The respondent failed to provide to the claimant written employment particulars and shall pay to the claimant four weeks' pay at £105 per week totalling £420.
  - (4) The respondent failed to follow the ACAS Code of Practice with regard to grievances in respect of the claimant's grievance regarding unpaid monies, and the award is uplifted by 25%.
- 2. The respondent shall pay to the claimant £9,076 subject to the usual statutory deductions, comprised as follows:

(3)	Unpaid holiday pay	£371.00
(2)	Unpaid overtime	£2,142.00
