Thank you for your e-mail of 29 September 2018 to the Ministry of Defence (MOD) requesting the following information:

"..... the medal entitlement and the date his medals were issued, to the following former RAF officer:

Air Commodore Peter WARBURTON MBE..."

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

A search for the information has now been completed within the MOD and I can confirm that some information in scope of your request is held.

I can confirm that his medal entitlement is as follows:

British War Medal
Victory Medal
Defence Medal
War Medal
MBE – issued in 1919

Information relating to the date Air Commodore Warburton's World War One and World War Two medals were issued is not held. Unfortunately for the World War Two medals, there are no medal records available to provide a date of issue.

Under Section 16 of the FOIA (Advice and Assistance) you may be interested to know World War One records of service are no longer held by the MOD. These records are now the responsibility of the National Archives and as such you can approach them directly to trace the records relating to an individual's the military service. In addition, information held on World War Two medal cards, where they exist, can be requested by writing directly to the Ministry of Defence Medal Office without referencing the Freedom of Information Act. Where the requester has a general research interest, access to data will be limited unless the service person died more than 25 years ago. Requests for World War Two medal cards can be made by writing to the following address and should include a copy of the death certificate:
