


Regional Stakeholder Network Member job description

The Office for Disability Issues (ODI) is setting up Regional Stakeholder Networks of disabled people.



The Network will talk about some of the work of the Government.



The Network will tell the Government how the work could be better for disabled people.



This will mean that the Government thinks about disability in their work.



9 Networks

There will be nine Networks.

There will be a Network in each of the English regions.



Each Network will have a Chair.

A **Chair** is a person who is in charge of a meeting.



They make sure that everything is in order.


The chair will talk to the ODI about the ideas that the members have.



There will be between 10 and 40 people in each Network.



We want people with different disabilities on the Network.



Themes

The Networks will each have a theme to talk about.

The theme will change every three months.



Meetings

ODI will have one meeting each year with the Networks.



For the rest of the year, the Government will ask members questions by email or other accessible ways.

Have links with other local disability organisations




Are able to make links to other disability organisations
