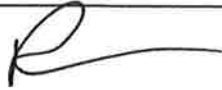

Notes to the Accounts Year ended 31 December 2017

1 Accounting Policies

a) Basis of Preparation

The financial statements of the Union have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 Section 1A applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland.

The accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention, in accordance with applicable accounting standards and on the going concern basis.

b) Income

Subscription income is accounted for when received by the Union or included in a return of income and expenditure from a branch. No allowance is made to reflect subscriptions due but not paid.

c) Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised on the accruals basis and includes expenses incurred by branches.

2 General Fund

The General fund has grown due to an increase in the number of members.

3 Organising Department Working Group Fund

This fund was established in 2009 to provide training, research and other support to help branches and members organise locally and nationally. There was no movement on the fund during the year. The balance held on the fund as at the balance sheet date amounted to £108.

Notes to the Accounts Year ended 31 December 2017

5 Officers' Responsibilities

The Trade Union and Labour Relations (Consolidation) Act 1992 requires the Union to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view. In preparing these financial statements the Union is required to:

- keep proper accounting records in respect of the transactions and the
- establish and maintain a satisfactory system of control of the Union's accounting records, cash holding and all receipts and remittances;
- ensure that such records are maintained so as to give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Union and to explain its transactions;
- prepare an annual return for the Certification Officer giving a true and fair view of the Revenue Account and Balance Sheet; and
- provide members with a statement of income and expenditure for the year.

Independent auditor's report to the members of the Industrial Workers of the World

We have audited the financial statements on pages 1 to 4 which have been prepared under the historical cost convention and the accounting policies set out on page 3.

Notes to the Accounts Year ended 31 December 2017

1 Accounting Policies

a) Basis of Preparation

The financial statements of the Union have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 Section 1A applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland.

The accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention, in accordance with applicable accounting standards and on the going concern basis.

b) Income

Subscription income is accounted for when received by the Union or included in a return of income and expenditure from a branch. No allowance is made to reflect subscriptions due but not paid.

c) Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised on the accruals basis and includes expenses incurred by branches.

2 General Fund

The General fund has grown due to an increase in the number of members.

3 Organising Department Working Group Fund

This fund was established in 2009 to provide training, research and other support to help branches and members organise locally and nationally. There was no movement on the fund during the year. The balance held on the fund as at the balance sheet date amounted to £108.
