## SPLI - Quarterly Update - 30 Sep to 31 Dec 18

## Introduction

1. This is the sixth quarterly report of Service Police Legacy Investigations (SPLI). It covers the period from 30 Sep to 31 Dec 18. In this quarter, SPLI has closed, or is in the process of closing, 8 full investigations and 6 directed lines of enquiry.

## Caseload

- 2.1 In the 18 months since SPLI took on the remaining legacy cases on 1 Jul 17, it has disposed of 88% of its caseload closing, or in the process of closing, 1127 allegations.
- 2.2. As at 31 December, SPLI's caseload consists of 19 full investigations and 18 directed lines of enquiry, which account for 151 allegations. An individual investigation or a directed line can be made up of multiple allegations. It is important to note that one allegation does not always equate to a single investigation or directed line.
- 2.3. Two allegations are at the case assessment stage.
