The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert the full width of Restricted Byway No.2 (part) from grid reference TL7776 8953 and running generally southwards and then westward for approximately 128 metres to grid reference TL7768 8945 and the full width of Restricted Byway No.4 (part) from grid reference TL7768 8945 and running generally southwards for approximately 105 metres to grid reference TL7766 8935 to Restricted Byway No,4 (part) starting from grid reference TL7766 8935 and running in a generally north westerly direction for 53 metres to grid reference TL7762 8939 and then runs in a northerly direction for 130 metres to grid reference TL 7776 8952 and then turns to run in an easterly direction for 128 metres to grid reference TL7776 8953. Within 8 weeks of the start date [by 30 May 2019]

Everyone who has made an objection or representation or any other written representation must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send full copies to the Authority. Copies (excluding copies of any supporting documents - these will be available to view at the Authority's offices) will also be sent to the applicant, every person who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order.

Within the same period the applicant (if applicable) must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, Secretary of State will send a full copy to the Authority. Copies will also be sent to everyone who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order (excluding copies of any supporting documents - these will be available to view at the Authority's offices).

Within 14 weeks of the start date [by 11 July 2019]

Everyone who has made an objection or representation, the Authority, the applicant (if applicable) and anyone who has written to us in respect of the Order must ensure that their comments on any or every other statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send copies of these comments to everyone else.

Any other person wishing to make representations in writing to the Secretary of State in respect of the above Order must do so in line with the timetable set out above.

PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

NORFOLK COUNTY COUNCIL (WEETING-WITH-BROOMHILL RB2 (PART) AND RB4 (PART)) DIVERSION ORDER 2017

This Order is made by Norfolk County Council ("the Authority") under Section 119 of the Highways Act 1980 ("the 1980 Act") because it appears to the Authority that in the interests of the Owners of the land crossed by the Restricted Byways described in paragraph 1 of this Order it is expedient that the line of the Restricted Byways should be diverted.

Weeting-with-Broomhill Parish Council and Breckland District Council have been consulted as required by Section 120(2) of the 1980 Act.

BY THIS ORDER:

1. The Restricted Byways over the land situate at Weeting-with-Broomhill and shown by a bold continuous line on the map contained in this Order and described in Part 1 of the Schedule to the Order shall be extinguished after 365 days from the date of confirmation of this Order but not before the day following the date of certification.

In this article, "date of certification" means the date on which Norfolk County Council, as the highway authority for the new highway mentioned in article 2, certify that such work has been carried out as is required to be done to bring the site of that highway into a fit condition for use by the public.

2. There shall at the end of 365 days from the date of confirmation of this Order be a Restricted Byway over the land situate at Weeting-with-Broomhill described in Part 2 of the Schedule and shown by a bold broken line on the map contained in this Order.

DESCRIPTION OF SITE OF EXISTING PATHS OR WAYS

<u>Restricted Byway No. 2 (part)</u> The full width of the way starting from grid reference TL7776 8953 (point A as shown on the map contained in this Order) and running generally southwards and then westward for approximately 128 metres to grid reference TL7768 8945 (point B as shown on the map contained in this Order).

<u>Restricted Byway No. 4 (part)</u> The full width of the way starting from grid reference TL7768 8945 (point B as shown on the map contained in this Order) and running generally southwards for approximately 105 metres to grid reference TL7766 8935 (point C as shown on the map contained in this Order).

DESCRIPTION OF SITE OF NEW PATH OR WAY

<u>Restricted Byway No. 4 (part)</u> Starts at grid reference TL7766 8935 (point C as shown on the map contained in this Order) and runs in a generally north westerly direction for 53 metres to grid reference TL7762 8939 (point E as shown on the map contained in this order) and then runs in a northerly direction for 130 metres to grid reference TL7763 8952 (point D as shown on the map contained in this order) and then turns to run in an easterly direction for 128 metres to grid reference TL7776 8953 (point A as shown on the map contained in this order). The width of the route is 8 metres.
